SUBJECT: Parks, Recreation, and Trails Master Plan Update: Trail Map Review – Existing and Previously Proposed Trails

RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommend that the Facilities Committee review and validate the updated trail map to confirm the accuracy of existing trails and previously identified proposed trail connections within LARPD's service area.

BACKGROUND

As part of the Parks, Recreation, and Trails Master Plan Update, staff has prepared a revised Trail Map illustrating both existing and previously identified proposed trails within the LARPD service area. The updated map builds upon the 2016 Master Plan version and incorporates changes reflecting trail development completed over the past decade, as well as proposed regional and local trail connections identified in prior planning efforts.

DISCUSSION:

The updated trail map consolidates information from District records, the City of Livermore, the East Bay Regional Park District (EBRPD), and other regional planning documents. It reflects the District's current understanding of trail conditions, recent additions, and proposed alignments carried forward from earlier planning efforts.

The purpose of this review is to ensure that the map accurately represents existing trails and previously identified proposed trails within LARPD's service area. Facilities Committee feedback will help confirm current conditions and support consistency between the District's map and those maintained by partner agencies.

Following this validation, staff will continue the trail planning process by working with the Alameda County Agricultural Advisory Committee – Trails Subcommittee for additional feedback.


NEXT STEPS:
